Holding of Classes in Hybrid Mode

- Shri Dharmendra Pradhan, Hon'ble Minister of Education inaugurated the Pushpagiri LHC on $20^{\rm th}$ Aug 2021.
- Classes commenced in hybrid mode on 27th Sept 2021.
- At Pushpagiri LHC (120 & 60 seaters → used to accommodate 60 & 30 students respectively following the distance norms of Covid)
- · About 70% of the students of IIT Bhubaneswar are now on campus and these students are attending classes in Hybrid Mode.

Hybrid mode: Running of classes simultaneously to both, the students attending a class in-person and those accessing by live streaming.

The institute devised a mechanism of holding classes in hybrid mode, equipped the Pushpagiri Lecture Hall Complex (PLHC) and realized the same.

The institute could quickly equip the complex to facilitate running lectures in Hybrid mode.

Bulk Water Dispute

- A tripartite Agreement was signed on 27.10.201 for supply of Bulk treated water to IIT Bhubaneswar between MEIL Bulk water project Pvt. Ltd and Government of Orissa.
- · The Matter is pending before the Hon'ble High Court of Orissa
- As directed by the Court the matter to be adjudicated by appointing Arbitrators by both the parties.
- Accordingly MEIL has appointed Ex-Chief Justice of India, Advocate Shri Dipak Mishra.
- On behalf of IIT Bhubaneswar Ex-Justice, Supreme Court of India, Advocate Shri Biswas war Prasad Singh was appointed as Arbitrator.

Bulk Water Dispute (contd.)

- The both side Arbitrators have appointed Former Justice Supreme Court of India, Advocate Shri, A. K. Sikri as the Presiding Arbitrator.
- The Arbitral Tribunal has fixed to the preliminary procedural hearing on the issues on 25.11.2021 at 4.00PM through video conferencing mode.
- On behalf of IIT BBS Advocate Shri Milan Kaungo, Senior Advocate, High Court of Odisha will represent the case and apprise the arbitrator.

PRESENT STATUS:

As the firm did not take any action towards restoration of the damaged solar plants after passage of 2 years & filed an application in the MSEFC, Chhattisgarh claiming the due amount, the institute recommends appointment of the Arbitrator as per the clause of the contract to settle the matter.

IIT Bhubaneswar team led by Dr. Remya Neelanchery, Assistant Professor, SIF bagged the Innovation award and cash prize at the prestigious Green Charcoal Hackathon, a technology challenge organized by National Thermal Power Plant (NTPC) and Energy Efficiency Services Limited (EESL). The award winning team, Dr. Remya Neelancherry, Shardul Narde (Mitteh student) and Neha Shukla Iresearch scholar) designed a microwave torrifier and pelletizer plant to produce 100 kg/d of charcoal from rice straw, one of the agricultural residues. The team presented the complete process and instrumentation of microwave torrifier, torrefaction operation details and business model canvas. The designed technology is capable of converting agroresidue to charcoal at a faster rate compared to conventional method. In addition, the charcoal pellets obtained from the process showed heating value comparable to that of coal. Along with this stunning achievement, the team will also receive financial assistance from NTPC for the development of machine prototype on the basis of mutually accepted terms and conditions.

B. Reasons for Poor Progress of works from NBCC:

a. Inadequate deployment of Manpower at less than 1/3rd gate

- b. Activities executed in sequential manner instead of parallel, synchronous mode,
- a. Non Effective follow up / project management by NBCC on detection of delays / failure
- c. Delay in rescinding of work and allocation of work to new agencies
- b. Delay in finalisation of drawings, designs by NBCC
- c. Submission of In-coherent designs, drawings etc. as received from consultant by NBCC,
- d. Yet to remobilise manpower to pre pandemic level even after lifting of lockdown in April.'20,

IIT BBS was the only IIT that allowed 2000 workers to stay in campus during lockdown period of Apr.'20. NBCC could not impress even 50% of the workers to stay after unlock in Apr.'20 and let them off. IIT BBS shared an SOP for 15 days quarantine & RT-PCR test in May 2020 for entry of workers into campus including a places in campus to set up quarantine centre. NBCC initially rejected the SOP and sought relaxation and subsequently asked IIT BBS to bear the cost.

NBCC took more than three months to convince the contractors to follow the SOP and started mobilising labourer in Sep.'20. However, the labour strength could not reach the pre pandemic level and he maxm. labour strength reached around 1000 in Mar.'21 but has now again reduced to 600.

C. Quality of Works & ATR on the Institute

Serious lapses in quality of the works executed by NBCC has been observed and some of them are listed as below:

- a. Repeatedly faulty and deficient designs submitted by NBCC & their consultant and that too with delays running into years
- b. Development of cracks in newly constructed basketball court
- c. Seepage in newly constructed building
- Casting of lintels by the ad-hoc rebarring method rather with the monolithic casting or dowel barring methods which are as per the building coad
- e. Poor workmanship in brick works, AAC block works, floor tiles and granite slabs
- f. Incorrect soil compaction inside plinth of buildings
- g. Inadequate curing & subsequent development of cracks in concrete paver blocks
- h. Absence of drainage facility & stagnation of water in pathway of newly constructed hostel
- i. Inadequate curing of newly constructed structures

j. Development of cracks in some of the building slabs poses safety concerns

The lapses in quality have been apprised to NBCC though multiple communications including to NBCC HQ and the Ministry but there is no significant improvement in the quality.

The Ministry letter was communicated to him vide email dated 12.05.2021.

On receipt of the above communication, Dr. Dhandole directly wrote an email dated 12.01.2021 to MOE towards alteration of his DOB with cc to the Registrar, IIT BBS. This kind of act is absolutely violating the norms of representation directly to the high functionaries totally ignoring the proper channels. Accordingly, he has been issued a Memo F. No. 2-2/2020, dated 31.05.2021.

Dr. Dhandole has again submitted a letter dated 05.08.2021, addressing to Dean (F&P) with a request to forward his fact/case to the Ministry again by highlighting the fact that his previous organization i.e. VNIT Nagpur make the necessary correction. The same has been examined by the Competent Authority and communicated to him with an advice to follow the instruction of Ministry letter no. F. No. 14-14/2018-TS-I, dated 06.05.2021 and also warned that any further such request will be treated as 'Misconduct' and appropriate action as per law will be initiated.

The Board took note of the above and directed the Institute not to entertain any such representation as it is not appropriate and legally correct to change the date of birth in the certificate at a later stage. This Institute may take appropriate action against the official for making such undue request after clear communication of non-acceptance.

BoG:42-40 To report that the status of the student's presence in the campus.

Director informed the house of the Heads and Deans that the Institute consciously decided to bring back its new students to the campus to complete the laboratory hands on with physical presence, give enough scope for peer learning, bringing the last year fresher's to the campus to break the monotony. But this has not yet happened fully. Currently, as on today, 1100 students are residing inside the Campus. The last batch of 472 students arrived at the campus a couple of days back. All the students are comfortably accommodated in the hostels. 200 of

them are kept in the newly inaugurated Rushikulya Hall of Residence (RHR).

The House complemented the Wardens, Hostel Staff for their commendable efforts in organizing smooth accommodation for the students despite adverse conditions and the Medical unit for the large scale screening. Only one student reported to have fever. However, he was confirmed to be Dengue after getting the test reports.

Director recalled that the action for getting the facilities ready on date was envisaged long back and we worked tirelessly with the PMC to make the RHR and Pushpagiri LHC ready by now. The present position would not have been possible without the continuous intervention of Director's Office and follow-up by the Institute Engineering Section.

The Board noted the above and appreciated the efforts of the Institute.

BoG:42-41 To report about lapses from sections has led to a small fall in the NIRF Ranking of the Institute 2020-21.

Director informed that in the current NIRF-21 ranking announced recently, the position of the Institute has been 28 amongst engineering institutions. On the first analysis with the help of the Programmer, it could be established that there have been lacunae in the system of ranking as well as anomalies in the submitted data by some sections of the Institute. There was erroneous data submission towards a disadvantage to the Institute despite pointing out by the Director for correction, the same wrong data was submitted.

The Institute has initiated action asking for show cause against those employees who defaulted on the submission of data.

Gracefully, none of the students have been found to be affected by Covid-19 till date after starting of the class. A strong sanitation practice and security supervision is underway to minimize such a possibility.
