Estimated Requirement



Considering that only 50 % users are active on a day, the average load for single run per day comes to 28200 Tf Hr












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14th Foundation Day Of IIT Bhubaneswar

	Board approved the recommendations of 43 rd meeting of the Finance Committee held on 11.03.2022.
BoG:44-5	To discuss about the latest status on the studies by faculty members of IIT Delhi, IIT Madras & IIT Bombay on the issue of crack in slab of LHC-2 and the recommendations of the expert committee.
	The Board deliberated on the detailed recommendations of the Expert Committee for rectification on the crack in the roof top slab. The crack was developed in the roof slab of 240 seater class room of LHC-2 in January 2019. This crack was detected by the Director himself during his regular inspection visit to the sites. Director constituted an Expert Committee to examine the cost and recommend remedies. The Committee constantly kept on contacting the Experts in the field at IIT Kharagpur, IIT Bombay, IIT Delhi and IIT Madras.
	The Board noted the recommendations of the Finance Committee based on the outcome of Expert Committee and BWC, as given below:
	a. As per design criteria guidelines by the Indian Standard, the designed structure should satisfy both limit state of serviceability and limit state of collapse and not restricted only to limit state of collapse.
	b. All investigators have converged to a point that the structure is required to be retrofitted followed by satisfactory load test before put on use since the crack is a through crack.
	c. NBCC should take note of the report of IIT Madras, in which the reasons of deficiency are highlighted in detailed manner and move forward by submitting the detailed methodology of retrofitting of the structure followed by load test for safe use of the structure. The proposed retrofitting methodology will be



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reviewed by the committee before implementation. This work is to be done with immediate effect as substantial time has elapsed since the observation of the crack.

d. At the time of conducting load test, provision should be made for dead load from kota/tile flooring, table & benches, podium etc. & the live load of occupants.

The Board considered and approved the recommendations of the Finance Committee to take immediate corrective actions in line with the suggestions of the Expert Committee, through NBCC.

BoG:44-6

To discuss about the latest status of the dispute towards supply of Bulk Water to the Institute against tripartite agreement and request for advice and direction on the legal opinion given by Institute authorized Legal Counsel.

The Board was appraised that under the Bulk water issue, Secretary, Ministry of Education wrote to the Chief Secretary, Govt. of Odisha to honour their commitment to supply of water free of project cost and try for an amicable solution. However, Govt. of Odisha without mentioning anything on their commitment advised the Ministry to honour the agreement, which implies that, IIT Bhubaneswar pays for the infrastructure also. In the meanwhile, arbitration proceedings have already been started and the Institute is to submit its Statement of Defence.

The Board discussed the present status of the issue of bulk water to be supplied to the Institute in a PPP mode in view of the arbitration proceedings and opinion from the Institute Legal Counsel as well as the stand taken by the Ministry. The following were resolved.

- 1. The Institute must submit its Statement of Defence to the Arbitration Tribunal constituted by both the parties on time. The deadline given by the Tribunal must be honoured.
- 2. IIT Bhubaneswar should approach the hon'ble High Court of Odisha (as per the jurisdiction) based on the legal opinion submitted by Institute's authorized legal counsel and instructions by the Ministry, as the Institute has explored all possible.



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opportunities in approaching MoE and hon'ble Chief Minister of Odisha in resolving the issue. BoG:44-7 To consider and approve revision of remuneration of outsourced manpower on consolidated payment as per the DOPT order and Govt. of Odisha fixation parameters. The Board deliberated the matter and approved the recommendations of the Finance Committee based on the suggestions of the Expert Committee detailed below towards enhancement of consolidated remuneration of some manpower working under outsourced basis in line with existing DoPT guidelines and labour laws in force. 1. The manpower working on outsourced basis in the Institute may be paid a fixed remuneration by the agency though which they have been engaged based on their qualifications, period of experience and performance of the assigned job. 2. They may be paid minimum of Rs.25300/- and maximum of Rs.40,000/- per month as per DoPT guidelines and Govt. of Odisha orders. 3. All these manpower working under outsourced basis will be guided by the policy of the outsource agency and there shall be no employee and employer relationship between them and IIT Bhubaneswar. 4. Agreed fixed remuneration will be made effective from 1st January 2022. 5. Such remuneration may be increased by 5% every year on 1st January subject to assessment of performance through the outsourced agency based on the feedback of the Institute. 6. These engagements shall be purely temporary in nature until appointment of regular positions through Institute regular recruitment process. To report about the status of filling of backlog vacancies especially in the SC, ST, OBC and EWS category in teaching Cadre as per the MoE vide DO No.33-2/2021-TS-III (Pt.I) dated 24.08.2021.

There are directions received from the Ministry for filling up of vacancies, as mentioned in the agenda statement. The Institute has not been able to carry out the regular selections of teaching and non-teaching staff for over two years since, the present Director is on extension mode from 21st February, 2020 and as per the Ministries advice to restrain as per the CVC guidelines. However, the Institute is very keen to carry on the selections for recruitments of teaching positions since 'no selections' for such a long time is detrimental to the growth of the institute. The Institute has requested several times with the proposal to carry out the faculty recruitment in view of the special circumstances, the Ministry of Education did not agree and advised the Institute to strictly follow the CVC guidelines.

The Institute follows flexible cadre structure for appointment of faculty members. But, in respect to the sanctioned strength (240 nos.), the total vacant position as on date is 107 nos. The Institute has the practice of recruiting throughout the year based on the rolling advertisement. But at present it is kept on hold from 21st February,

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2020 since the present Director's regular term was ended after two months from that date.

Hon'ble members of the Board were requested to kindly take an appropriate decision and advice the Institute for further steps towards commencing of selection/recruitment process under the Chairmanship of the present Director as a special case in order to overcome the above situation and also to meet the requirement of the Ministry with the specified timeline to fill up the existing 107 nos. of vacancies as well as the administrative work can be carried out smoothly.

The ministry responded stating that the institute should not proceed with the selection process under the chairmanship of the present Director.

The Board noted the above and advised the Institute honour the advice of the Ministry. In this meeting and in earlier Board meetings, the Board already expressed its concurrence about the need for carrying on selections. The BoG appreciated and agreed with the need for carrying on recruitments as proposed by the Institute as also done in earlier meetings. Chairman, BoG reported that he also wrote to the Ministry for consideration of the proposal.

IIT Bhubaneswar has withheld an amount of Rs.7.64 Crores from the reimbursement bill of NBCC, as NBCC had not credited the project account with the interest recovered on Mobilization Advance. The said Mobilization Advance was paid by NBCC to M/s. Simplex out of the project fund of IIT.

Hence, IIT has been maintaining a stand that the interest accrued on such Mobilization Advance should be credited to the project account and not appropriated by NBCC.

On the matter legal opinion sought by NBCC from Additional Solicitor General of India (ASGI) was communicated to us vide their letter No.1018 dt. 22.07.2021. As per the opinion, "IIT's claim for the interest recovered by the NBCC from mobilization advance paid to its contractor, is clearly beyond the terms and not within the scope and ambit of Agreement dated. 02.05.2016".

IIT also collected legal opinion on the matter from our authorized counsel, Shri Milan Kannungo, Senior Advocate, Odisha High Court which is as follows:

'I am of the considered opinion that the claim of NBCC for refund of deduction made towards interest received from the executing agency is not sustainable in the eyes of law and not permissible as per the agreement between the parties. It has been specifically stated that NBCC shall be paid actual cost of work plus agency charges at the rate of 5.5%. Under the circumstances, NBCC cannot be permitted to make profits out of the project cost which is specifically meant for development of the Institute'.

The same has been communicated to the NBCC.

The Board noted the above.





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BoG:44-33

To report about sanction of lease of Govt. land measuring Ac. 618.665 dec. in mauza Aragul, Kholadwar, Kansapada and Podapada under Jatni Tahasil of Khordha district and Godiput-Matiapada under Delanga Tahasil of Puri District free of premium and incidental charges but subject to payment of Rs. 100/- per acre per annum towards annual ground rent and cess @ 75% of annual ground rent for establishment of IIT Bhubaneswar.

- 1. The State Government vide its commitment of 2008 have given physical possession of 943.47 acre of land in favour of IIT Bhubaneswar by 2011 in phases for its main campus at Argul, Khordha.
- 2. The breakup of the land schedule are as follows:

a. Govt. Land : 628.799 acreb. Forest Land : 302.377 acre

c. Pvt. Land : 12.295 acre Total : 943.471 acre

- 3. Formal Advance possession of govt. land was given in phases (516.955 acre in 10.02.2009, 78.57 acre in 15.09.2010, 23.14 acre on 12.01.2022 and balance 10.134 acre is under alienation process)
- 4. Possession of 12.295 acre private land was given by GoO dt.09.06.2015 by purchasing from land owners.
- Although physical possession of 302.377 acre of forest land has given to by IIT by 2011 with construction of boundary wall, diversion of forest land is under process with Palli Sabha completed by 2016 and further processing awaited by District Forest Office.
- 6. GoO has now sanctioned for lease of Govt. land measuring 618.665 (516.955+78.57+23.14) acre vide State cabinet's 42nd Meeting held on 10.01.2022.

Approval may please be accorded for entering into a lease agreement with GoO for 618.665 acre of land and pay the statutory fees to the GoO

The Board agreed to the recommendations of the Finance Committee towards reconsideration of revision of order by Govt. of Odisha asking IIT Bhubaneswar to pay the ground rent and cess as part of the leasest



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IIT Bhubaneswar should be given complete tax free ownership. These taxes should also not be applied to the Institute for its previous years of allotment. It was learnt that IIT Kharagpur doesn't pay such tax to their local state Govt.

Shri Tapan Kumar Satapathy, Additional Secretary, Skill Development, Govt. of Odisha who attended the meeting on behalf of Principal Secretary, Skill Development, GoO opined that the annual ground rent and cess is payable by IIT Bhubaneswar as the transfer of land is governed under the Odisha Govt. Land Settlement (OGLS) Act 1962. The lease will be valid for 99 years where IIT Bhubaneswar will be the absolute owner of the land.

The Board unanimously resolved that the Revenue Department, Govt. of Odisha be approached for complete ownership and remission of ground rent and cess in line with allotment of land IIT Kharagpur and other national educational institute in Odisha.

To report that Separate Audit Report (SAR) and Audit Certificate on the accounts of Indian Institute of Technology, Bhubaneswar for the year 2020-21 have been received from Director General of Audit (Central), Hyderabad.

The Audit Certificate—cum-Separate Audit Report of the CAG along with Action Taken Note have already been incorporated in the printed copy of Annual Accounts (both English and Hindi) for 2020-21 and were sent to MoE on 31st January 2022 for placing the same before both Houses of the Parliament.

The Board noted the above. The reports have been very clean and without any major observations.

To report on the status of progress of Phase-II constructions under execution by NBCC, delays therein, interventions tried by IIT, lack of manpower deployment and progress achieved till now.





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- 1. NBCC has achieved 69% Physical Progress against target of 100% completion by now.
- There has been a serious failure on progress of works by NBCC since inception till date without any improvement.
 According to IITBBS, the reasons for failure to fulfil the commitment on the part of NBCC are listed below.

i. Improper selection of contractors :

- M/s SKPL achieved only 50% progress in external development even after a long delay beyond the delivery time.
- ➤ M/s Lalitendu achieved only 9.5% for sewerage network even after a long delay beyond the delivery time.
- ii. Lack of accountability, proper project management and planning,
 - Not been able to impress upon M/s SKPL to improve progress or alternatively encash PBG for poor performance
 - NBCC is not prompt enough to impose penalty or call for fresh tender by rescinding works in case of nonperformance by agencies
- iii. Low level manpower deployment at 33% and lack of control on the contractors
- iv. Faulty designs and non-submission of designs on time
 - Use of non-acoustic boards for acoustic treatment in classroom of LHCs
 - Delay in submission of design of canopy of CRIF, Glazing of Stand Building, samples for approval etc.
 - Wrongly casting the level of pathway without referring the drawings at SES Extn., SMM&ME & SEOCS and installing unapproved samples
 - Delay in submission of design & working drawing of external developments for various buildings
- v. Lapses on quality leading to re-working



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- Non attachment of mortar below granite slabs of flooring
- Continuous practice of unaesthetic projection of dado / skirting
- Undulations in finished level of kota/granite flooring
- 3. Unable to deliver, NBCC has been making excuses by misrepresenting following facts
 - i. Non deposit of Rs.290 cr under Cl.1.8 of MoA
 - ii. Repeated complaining about Money withheld by IIT against non-achievement of milestone against MoA provisions
 - iii. Repeated complaining about Money withheld by IIT against Mobilisation Advance Interest despite opinion of ASG
 - iv. Repeated complaining about Money withheld in the name of GST
- 4. The misrepresentation of facts by NBCC are explained hereafter:
 - i. Non deposit of Rs.290 cr under Cl.1.8 of MoA: The Institute has commenced extending deposit of Rs10 cr. to NBCC after approval from BoG.
 - ii. Money withheld by IIT against non achievement of milestones: The projects have been delayed inordinately and NBCC is not penalizing the agency for the agencies fault
 - iii. Money withheld by IIT against Mobilisation Advance Interest: IIT has shared its legal opinion in response's to NBCC's legal opinion from ASG. IIT's legal team has opined that "NBCC can't be permitted to make profit out of project cost which is specifically meant for development of the Institute".

Money withheld in the name of GST: The matter is now subjudiced.

The matter was discussed in the 37th B&WC meeting dt. 14th Dec 2021. The B&WC examined the claims from NBCC and the explanation given by IIT and unanimously agreed that the withholdings by IIT are not only very genuine, but also very appropriate.
