

IIT students get annual pre-placement offer up to Rs 43 lakhs amid Corona crisis

The students of IIT Bhubaneswar have received excellent pre-placement offers amid concerns of effective campus placements in 2020-21 due to Corona Virus (Covid-19) epidemic. This is being considered as the first offer to IIT students this year.
