	However, since MHRD has put the funding pattern of present infrastructure development through HEFA, Board agreed to the recommendations of the Finance Committee of sending the proposal on early basis for their consideration. Lab equipment should be purchased through Research Grant as far as possible.
	Chairman expressed concern on the repayment part of HEFA loan, in case MHRD does not pay, the liability of such repayment rests with the individual institutes (as per agreed terms). This needs to be addressed while disbursement of loan. The concern may be raised by MHRD with RBI for making provisions for timely repayment of the dues.

	As per the Institute Faculty Recruitment Policy normally Visiting Faculty are appointed on a contractual position for a fixed tenure. But sometimes a candidate coming from a regular position in some Govt. Institutes also get selected on a visiting mode. In that case, the candidate can only accept the offer if his/ her pay is protected and his candidature is accepted against lien.
	Board after detailed discussion agreed to the proposal and recommended that the same be adopted by the Institute in attracting good candidates for faculty position on the following terms:
	 Offer be issued for a visiting position at different levels giving a fixed tenure maximum of three years. The faculty continue against the regular position and should get all benefits like a regular faculty of the Institute. His/ her last pay drawn in the parent organization be protected, as the case may be. Such selected faculty shall have to go back to its parent organization on completion of the tenure. System of regularization on the same position will not be applicable to such faculty members. In case they want to come on a regular position they have to apply afresh and come through the regular selection procedure.
	Board considered the proposal and approved the same for implementation in the Institute.
BoG:33-36	To consider and approve a proposal for signing of an MoU with the University of Auckland for a Joint Ph.D programme in the Institute.
	Director informed that the Institute is planning to have a Joint Ph.D programme with the University of Auckland. IIT Bhubaneswar will be 2 nd to IIT Bombay for creating such facility. There is no financial implication on the part of the Institute. To start with, the number will



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be kept low. All the disciplines across the schools will be involved in such programme. However, Institute would like to go for the disciplines on which the University is known for at the beginning.
Board approved the proposal and recommended to make it in a phase manner.
