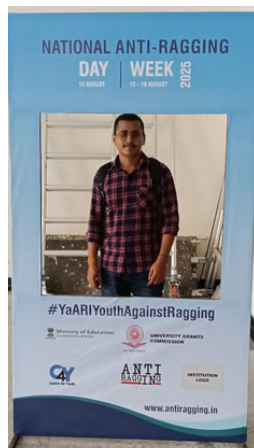
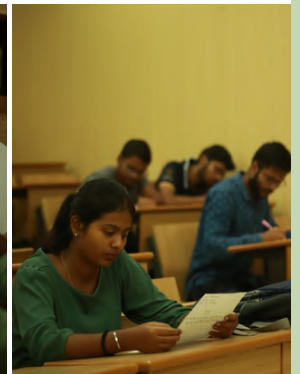
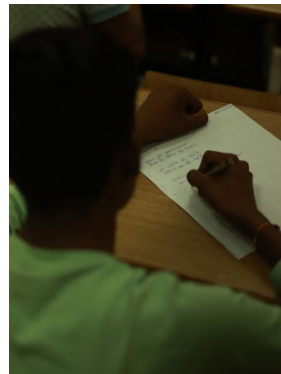
Anti-Ragging Week

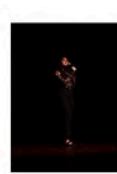


Etheria 2025
