

*	Board approved the recommendations of 47 th meeting of the Finance Committee held on 28.06.2023.
BoG:48-5	Introduction of Integrated Teachers Education Program (ITEP) with effect from academic year 2023-24.
	ITEP was discussed in the 55th Senate meeting on 13th June 2022 (item 55.A.B.2). As a major step towards transforming Higher Education Institutions into Multidisciplinary Institutions as per NEP-2020, IIT Bhubaneswar sought approval of the National Council for Technical Education (NCTE) to start a 4-year ITEP in the two disciplines of B.ScB. Ed, and B.AB.Ed. This program is expected to generate highly talented teachers. The 4-year ITEP would be opened to all students who choose teaching as a profession after Higher Secondary. This integrated course will be beneficial for the students, as they will save 1 year by completing this course in 4 years against the normal duration of 5 years. Admission for the ITEP would be carried out by the National Testing Agency (NTA) through the National Common Entrance Test (NCET).
	BoG approved to start the programme with effect from the AY 2023-24 and advised the institute to devise self-sustaining revenue model in future.
BoG:48-6	Sanction of a loan of upto Rs. 20 cr. from IRG for SATHI (Sophisticated Analytical & Technical Help Institute) project submitted to DST.
(8	SATHI is a shared, science and technology infrastructure facility at a lead Institute with major analytical instruments and advanced manufacturing facility for academia, start-ups, manufacturing units,

industries and R&D Labs. IIT BBS submitted a SATHI proposal as a lead Institute along with cluster partners: CSIR IMMT, CIPET, ICT-Mumbai Bhubaneswar, IOP and NIT Rourkela. The proposal is worth Rs. 80 cr., out of which 75% (Rs. 60 cr.) will be funded by DST provided the remaining 25% (Rs. 20 cr.) is secured by the Lead Institute and its cluster and industry partners. The proposal is shortlisted and a final round is expected in July 2023.

BoG approved the proposal to meet upto Rs 20 cr. from IRG.

BoG:48-7 To consider and approve the revised Relocation Policy of IIT Bhubaneswar.

This is regarding relocation of faculty, officers and staff joining the Institute for the first time on regular / contract positions. The existing ceiling has not been revised since April 2010. It is proposed to revise the upper ceiling of reimbursement of relocation expenses as follows:

The terms and conditions for reimbursement of such relocation charges are as follows.

1. A person appointed as a faculty /Group A officer in the Institute from within India or abroad on regular basis or on contract for a limited period not less than 3 years will be eligible for reimbursement on submission of bills for only (i) travel expenses (2nd AC Train/air economy tickets in shortest route) for self and spouse, (ii) expenses incurred on transfer of personal goods up to 6000 kg and (iii) cost of transportation of personal conveyance, from the last place of work / residence to the place of posting subject to above ceiling. All

other costs like cost of packing materials, accompanying person etc. are to be borne by the person concerned.

- Train/ air tickets in shortest route must be booked through three authorised travel agents viz (i) Indian Railways Catering and Tourism Corporation Limited (IRCTC) or (ii) M/s Balmer Lawrie & Company Limited or (iii) M/s Ashok Travels & Tours.
- Such relocation charge is to be refunded by the faculty/officer/ staff
 to the Institute in case of leaving the Institute before completion of
 three years. Simple interest applicable to GPF is also to be paid.
 Every application for relocation charge will be accompanied by such
 a declaration.
- The transfer of goods must be completed within twelve months from the date of joining the Institute after which the claim for reimbursement of relocation charges shall lapse.

However, for staff members working in permanent position in any Govt. / CFTIs / PSUs and to join IIT Bhubaneswar as a regular employee on Technical Resignation or on deputation / lien, their relocation charges would be reimbursed as per Central Govt. / TA Rules on transfer.

To consider and approve the proposal for implementation of the 'House Building Advance Rules (HBA) 2017' for central Government employees in the Institute.

Government of India in the Ministry of Housing & Urban Affairs has already prescribed and circulated the 'House Building Advance (HBA) Rules 2017 for Central Government employees vide OM No. 117011 / 11(4) / 2016-H-III dated 9.11.2017 effective from the date of issue of the same order. The salient features of said Rules are indicated below:

- All Permanent employees are eligible for HBA.
- Maximum amount of advance for construction / purchase of new house / flat would be 34 times of basic pay or cost of house or repaying capacity of the employee or ₹ 25 lakh, which is least. The repaying capacity will be governed as per para 6 of office memorandum dated 9-11-2017 of Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs, Gol.

- Such advance for expansion of existing house would be 34 times
 of basic pay or cost of expansion or repaying capacity of the
 employee or ₹10 lakh, which is least.
- In case of construction in rural areas, advance will be restricted to 80 per cent of above limits.
- Interest on HBA would be 8.5 % to be reviewed in every three years.
- The advance would be recoverable in 180 monthly instalments and interest thereafter in not more than 60 instalments.
- New house is to be constructed on plot owned by the employee or spouse either jointly or individually.
- Outright purchase of new house /flat from Housing Boards, Development Authorities, registered builders, house building Societies etc. are permissible but not from private individuals.
- On completion/ purchase of the house/ flat, same is to be immediately insured and mortgaged to the President of India.
- It was proposed to implement the 'House Building Advance (HBA)
 Rules 2017" framed by the Govt. of India in the Institute. List of
 applicants will be maintained separately for faculty, officers and
 staff, who may be considered in order of seniority of applications
 (first-cum-first-first-served) within the budgetary provision. Every
 year budgetary allocation may be made for this purpose from OH36 (salary head) of Grant-in-Aid.

BoG approved the proposal in principle from IRG instead of OH-36. However, a detailed plan of execution is to be made by the Institute before the proposal being implemented.

To consider and approve the proposal for construction of Balance Works of Administrative Building at IIT Bhubaneswar for an amount of Rs. 28.65 Crore.

The Administrative Buildings of IIT Bhubaneswar was constructed by CPWD during Phase-I construction. The Building was occupied by the

Institute in July'2018 without completion / finishing of the following works.

- Interior works of Senate Hall, Conference Hall, Board Room, Director's Room.
- · External development, Parking, pathway etc.
- The Institute decided to complete the balance works of the Main Administrative Building through CPWD as PMC.
- CPWD submitted the preliminary estimate of Rs. 32.52 Crore based on the concept plan accepted by the competent authority of the Institute for the aforesaid works.
- The B&WC approved the proposal for completion of the balance works of main Building through CPWD in its 39th meeting held on 22.03.2023.
- Thereafter, the preliminary estimate submitted by CPWD was optimised by the Institute & brought down to Rs.28.65 cr after scrutiny.
- 5) Accordingly, a proposal with a preliminary estimated cost of Rs.28.65 Crore has been prepared for the completion of balance works of Main Building of IIT Bhubaneswar. The work is intended to be funded through HEFA loan. MoE has sanctioned Rs.240 cr. towards balance works in Mar.'2023 out of which Rs.200 cr. is provisioned for works assigned to NBCC & Rs.40 cr. for work to be assigned to CPWD as discussed above.

FC is requested for concurrence to award Administrative Approval (A/A) & Expenditure Sanction (E/S) to CPWD for the Balance Works of the Administrative Building at IIT Bhubaneswar for Rs. 28.65 Crore.

This is a proposal of a career progression policy for Assistant Professor and Associate Professor of the Institute, when selections through open advertisement either do not happen or are restricted to reserved category candidates, for more than a year. The selection procedure in this policy is identical in all respects to selection via open advertisement presently in vogue, except that the advertisement is not open but circulated internally to the faculty of IIT Bhubaneswar. This policy is expected to give a fair opportunity for career progression across all categories of faculty candidates, and has been recommended by the Heads and Deans Committee of the Institute.

To consider and approve the introduction of Master of Science Programme for Research (MS Programme by research) for Engineering Discipline at IIT Bhubaneswar from the next Academic Session 2023-24 as recommended by Senate in its 57th & 59th Meeting.

To increase research output, IIT Bhubaneswar is launching a Master of Science Program (MS-R) for research to utilize the skills of talented B. Tech. students, who are interested in research but not willing to spend 5-6 years for a Ph.D. Interested MS students can be upgraded to Ph.D. depending on their progress. Such a program is operational in IIT Madras. The minimum duration of the program will be two-and-half academic years with institute fellowship. Salient features of the program are given below:

The maximum intake would be 100 students.

- Eligible applicants include those employed at IIT Bhubaneswar projects with a B. Tech / B.E. and GATE score. The external applicants sponsored by an approved Industry / organization / institution with R&D facilities with GATE score. GATE score is not required for applicants having a B.Tech from any of the CFTIs with a CGPA ≥ 8.0.
- MS (R) students will receive fellowship of ₹12,400 per month except for sponsored students.
- If a MS(R) student wishes, he/she and can convert to the Ph.D. Program after 1.5 years with the recommendation of the Doctoral Selection Committee.
- Admissions will be made twice a year, and the proposed program will start in 2023-24.

The financial implication for 100 MS(R) students is Rs. 1.5 crores approx. per year for the 2.5-years programme.

BoG approved the proposal.

BoG:48-16

To consider and approve the increase of Ph.D. students strength due to an increase in Faculty strength, as recommended by 58th Senate Meeting.

According to UGC Regulations, a Professor, Associate Professor, and Assistant Professor can guide up to 8, 6, and 4 PhD scholars, respectively, at any time. The 59th Research Programme Evaluation Committee proposed increasing the PhD student intake from 449 to 680 due to increased faculty strength from 120 to 170 (at the time of the senate meeting). The Senate recommended this increase to the Finance Committee and BoG for consideration, keeping the Faculty: Ph.D. student ratio at 1:4 and following reservation guidelines for SC/ST/OBC students with a provision of 10% seats for EWS.

As per rule, the tenure of a Ph.D. Scholar's fellowship is five (05) years.

The additional financial implication for the increased strength of 231 students (680-449) will be Rs. 8.5 Crores per annum for initial 2 years (JRF (@ Rs. 31,000 per month) and Rs. 9.7 Crores per annum form 3rd year onwards (SRF (@ Rs. 35,000 per month).

Delegation of Financial Power to Chairperson, Warden Council as per the Rules and Regulations for Management of Halls of Residence.

Rules and Regulations for Management of Halls of Residence was recommended by the Senate in its 32nd meeting on 19.08.2016 which was approved by the BoG in its 24th Meeting held on 30.08.2016. In the said regulations, the financial powers delegated to different functionaries from hostel funds are as follows:

(a) Associate Warden

: Up to Rs.50,000/-

(b) Warden

: Up to Rs.2,00,000/-

(c) Chairperson, Warden Council: Above Rs.2,00,000/-

In (c) above, it is evident that the Chairperson, Warden Council is having unlimited financial authority. It was proposed to limit his financial authority up to Rs.10,00,000/- comparable to that of Dean (SRIC).

FC reviewed the proposal along with the Financial powers approved by the BoG in its 16th meeting vide item no. BoG.16-5 dated 02.12.2014 and recommended the following <u>from student funds</u>:

(a) Associate Warden

: Up to 25,000/-

(b) Warden

: Up to 50,000/-

(c) Chairperson, Warden Council: Above Rs.50,000/- and upto

Rs. 2,00,000 /-.

(d) Dean (Students Affairs): Above Rs. 2,00,000 and upto Rs.10,00,000.
